Ken Tuley has been using technology since 1977, when a fellow teacher brought a computer to school. Ken promptly bought his own computer (TI-99/4) and started using it in his band and music classes. Ken became the Director of Learning Technology for Albuquerque Public Schools in 1995, implementing a comprehensive professional development program for all district employees. His efforts around a 1:1 plan to provide all district and school leadership the technology and support with an end goal of 1:1 for all students as well, caught the eye of Apple. Apple recognized Ken as an Apple Distinguished Educator in 1999 and quickly asked him to

present at national conferences on behalf of Apple. While continuing to provide technology based professional development to teachers, Ken joined the Apple Professional Learning team in 2008, delivering professional development to teachers and administrators across the country. Ken retired from public education in 2014, continues his Apple teaching and in his spare time flies hot air balloons, and produces all the video for the Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta.
